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Former Salesman Enjoined Under Non-Compete Agreement

Former employee lied to employer, and may not have sufficient funds to pay a judgment.

Last month, the Seventh Circuit Court of Appeals (covering Illinois, Indiana and Wisconsin), enjoined a former employee under a Non-Compete Agreement. The agreement provided that the salesman would not compete with the employer by soliciting any customers for one year. The Court reversed the lower court's denial of an injunction, and cited the former employee's deceitfulness to the employer about his next employment. Also, the Court held that, absent an injunction, the former employee may not be "good for" any future money judgment, and that the employer may be entitled to a bond or letter of credit.
